

TASK 3. Match the descriptions of various playground objects with their pictures.

THE PLAYGROUND for an inclusive school

- A. For the SWING ZONE, we selected a tire swing because of space limitations. Up to three children can easily play on a tire swing at the same time, thus encouraging cooperative play.
- B. The NATURAL ZONE was developed around the periphery of the playground, throughout the planting area and a large open field for running and football, kickball and other outdoor games.
- C. The STORAGE ZONE includes a convenient lockable storage unit for playground equipment such as balls, jump ropes, and dramatic play props, as well as maintenance tools such as brooms and rakes.
- D. In the SAND PLAY, there is a shelter which diffuses direct sunlight into the sand pit / box. An accessible sand table is provided for children in wheelchairs.
- E. The COMFORT ZONE consists of a structure for shade, wooden bench, and brick seating.
- F. The GROSS MOTOR ZONE is a composite play structure with easy access for children and their assistants.
- G. The wooden structures reinforce the curriculum and provide DRAMATIC PLAY opportunities. From left to right: a replica of Alabama's state capital, a play stage, and a pair of playhouses.
- н. The HARD SURFACE ZONE is an activity street that includes pavement (AmE sidewalk) games and <u>Bank Shot Basketball</u>, an accessible sport that incorporates the skill of billiard's shot-making with the fun of basketball.
